Attendance Policy: Attendance will not be taken for class and is not a direct component of the course grade. Please do not attend class if you are feeling unwell. Course notes will be posted after each class, and other resources are available to help you catch up on any missed material.

With that said, class attendance is incredibly useful to personal learning and success, and I highly encourage every student to attend. Keeping up with material is instrumental to your success and continued learning. In addition, quizzes will take place during class that are a fundamental component of the grade.

Communication Policy: I will respond to any email sent during the week within 24-48 hours, excluding weekends and university breaks (meaning, for instance, if you write to me on Friday afternoon, you might not receive a response until Monday - so please plan accordingly). If you send me an email after 5pm, I will usually respond the next business day. If you do not hear from me within 48 hours, please send me a follow-up email or remind me in class. Any communications must be sent to me through your Penn State email - while you may use Canvas messages, I strongly encourage you to use email.

I encourage students to use office hours, and welcome emails and/or appointments if the posted times do not work. I cannot know you are struggling unless you tell me. The sooner you reach out, the quicker I can help – so please do not hesitate to send me a message or talk to me.

Assessments

Exams: We will have four exams as part of this course – three 75-minute exams during the semester and a cumulative final exam during the week of finals. Exam rooms will be announced later. Quizzes: Quizzes will be administered in-class more or less on a weekly basis. There will be 12–13 quizzes throughout the semester, each covering material that was on the homework due on the previous day.

Unless otherwise stated, quizzes will be at the beginning of class. If you are late for a quiz, you may start late (if there is time left) and you will have the amount of time that the class has left. You will not receive extra time from being late. If you miss a quiz from being late, unless previously discussed, you will be unable to make up the quiz.

Online Homework: Online homework will be assigned through Achieve, including section homework and Learning Curves. If you unsure as to whether you will be staying in this class, you may enroll in Achieve for free for two weeks. At the end of the two weeks, you will need to purchase a license for access.

Written Homework: Students are responsible for ensuring their work is uploaded correctly and completely by the deadline. Homework submissions will be done through Gradescope - more information will be discussed during the first week of class. Illegible, blank, unopenable and/or incorrectly submitted assignments will receive a grade of zero if they cannot be graded. Only one assignment is allowed to be resubmitted if done incorrectly – so ask questions early to learn how to submit correctly. Assignments submitted after the deadline without previously requesting an extension or because of extenuating circumstances will not be graded.

Extension Policy: All makeup quizzes and homework (online and/or written) extensions must be completed promptly. Preferably, students should complete their makeup quiz and assignments within 24 - 72 hours from the regular quiz and homework due dates. In case of illness or prolonged circumstances, students will receive a makeup quiz when they can but may be required to present university-approved documentation. Makeup quizzes and homework extensions are only given if a student has a valid excuse and informs the course instructor by email of their absence and inability to participate the day prior to the quiz or when the homework is due.

If you know ahead of time that you will be unable to complete a homework assignment or quiz due to extenuating circumstances, email me before the assignment is due, and I will usually grant an extension (within reason). If you are unable to contact me before the due date, contact me as soon as possible. I am unable to give extensions on written homework assignments after solutions have been posted, and no extensions will be given beyond the last day of class for the semester.

• Students who participate in the evening LA sessions tend to perform, on average, 5-8% higher on course exams than students who do not attend the sessions.

• Students who regularly worked in groups in class (with the help of LAs and instructors for 10 – 20 minutes during lectures) and attended evening sessions regularly have seen their overall grades improved by almost a full letter grade.
